Thought-provoking play, *Intimate Apparel*, explores the lives of women, love and social issues in early 1900s

Colorado Springs (January 9, 2018) — The Theatre Company of the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center at Colorado College is excited to present the touching play, *Intimate Apparel* by Lynn Nottage, Feb. 8-25, 2018 and directed by Scott RC Levy.

Playwright Lynn Nottage is the winner of two Pulitzer Prizes — making history as the first female playwright to win two Pulitzers for drama, the first woman of color to win two of these prestigious awards in any category, and the second African-American playwright to be recognized twice. Nottage is also the winner of the 2004 New York Drama Critics Circle Award, and the Outer Critics Circle Award, among many others.

This beautifully written and intensely personal story weaves a delicate tapestry of the joys and sorrows of an African-American seamstress in 1905 New York City. Esther sews elegant intimates for socialites and prostitutes alike as a vibrant cast of characters plays part in her determined search for love and respect in a world that seems to overlook her.

The story of the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center at Colorado College (FAC) begins with the founding of the Broadmoor Art Academy by Julie and Spencer Penrose in 1919. During the Great Depression, three dedicated

philanthropists — Julie Penrose, Alice Bemis Taylor, and Elizabeth Sage Hare — envisioned expanding the Broadmoor Art Academy into an entire arts district under one roof. The FAC changed its name, built a grand building, and opened as the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center in 1936. In August 2016, the FAC announced an historic alliance with Colorado College and on July 1, 2017, became the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center at Colorado College. The FAC is deeply rooted in the legacy of its founders, who possessed bold visions, a deep passion for the arts, and dedication to the Colorado Springs community. The FAC honors this legacy and spirit today by providing innovative, educational, and multidisciplinary arts experiences designed to elevate the individual spirit and inspire community vitality, building on its history as a unique cultural pillar of the Pikes Peak region.
