The Fine Arts Center opens the 2018-19 theatre season with the regional premiere of *Shakespeare in Love*

Colorado Springs (Aug. 28, 2018) — The Fine Arts Center Theatre Company is excited to present *Shakespeare in Love*, directed by Scott RC Levy, Sept. 27-Oct. 21, 2018.

Shakespeare in Love is a play with music that was adapted for the stage from the 1998 film by Tony and Olivier Award-winning writer Lee Hall, based on the screenplay by Academy Award-winning writer Marc Norman, and Tony, Olivier, and Academy Award-winning writer Tom Stoppard.

A romantic piece of historical fiction, the story centers around a young Will Shakespeare as he struggles to find his inspiration. Enter the feisty aristocratic Viola de Lesseps, who longs to be an actor. The relationship they forge serves as inspiration for Will's greatest play – *Romeo and Juliet*. This stage adaptation employs tactics commonly found in plays of the Elizabethan age: cross-dressing disguises, mistaken identities, suspicions of adultery, sword fighting, a comedic nurse, and even visions of ghosts are all present, as is the enduring "play-within-a-play" convention that Shakespeare fondly adopted for many of his works. Overall, *Shakespeare in Love* delivers a delightfully crowd-pleasing, deeply romantic, and highly adventurous tale of love and drama in Renaissance-era England.

The cast includes Seth Dhonau (making his FAC debut as Will Shakespeare), Carley Cornelius (as Viola, previously seen in *Enchanted April*), Birgitta DePree (as Queen Elizabeth), Dastan Harrison, Ben Hilzer, Dwayne Carrington, Jareth Spirio, Damon Guerassio, Michael Augenstein, Carmen Shedd, Dana Kjdesen, Maggie Tisdale, Kyle Dean Steffen, Lisbeth Splawn, Mark Cannon, Nels Jacobson, Micah Speirs, Joe O'Rear, Peter Bussian, Sean Verdu, and Conner Graves.

Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center at Colorado College

The story of the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center at Colorado College (FAC) begins with the founding of the Broadmoor Art Academy by Julie and Spencer Penrose in 1919. During the Great Depression, three dedicated philanthropists — Julie Penrose, Alice Bemis Taylor, and Elizabeth Sage Hare — envisioned expanding the Broadmoor Art Academy into an entire arts district under one roof. The FAC changed its name, built a grand building, and opened as the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center in 1936. In August 2016, the FAC announced an historic alliance with Colorado College and on July 1, 2017, became the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center at Colorado College. The FAC is deeply rooted in the legacy of its founders, who possessed bold visions, a deep passion for the arts, and dedication to the Colorado Springs community. The FAC honors this legacy and spirit today by providing innovative, educational, and multidisciplinary arts experiences designed to elevate the individual spirit and inspire community vitality, building on its history as a unique cultural pillar of the Pikes Peak region.
